Cllr Smith queried the fact that the invoices from K Fergusons Ltd for the groundsman contract duties appear to be very high compared to those of last year from Robert Howard. Cllr P Wilson proposed and Cllr G Wilson seconded that an analysis on the invoices should be carried out by the Finance & Emergency Committee at its next meeting on 24th July with a report back to Full Council at the next available meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

Cllr Fairchild proposed and Cllr G Wilson seconded that all of the above accounts should be authorised. Motion carried unanimously.

The Clerk advised that in an attempt to keep postage costs down it had been suggested that she should email as many remittance advice notes as possible but this will affect the checking procedure put in place for BACS payments. She therefore wished to suggest that with immediate effect all BACS payments should be checked by one councillor against the bank statements from month to month and this can be carried out following the Full Council meetings. She will also copy Cllr Tindall or Cllr Parr with the remittance advice notes she has issued. Cllr Fairchild proposed and Cllr G Wilson seconded that this system should be agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

8. CORRESPONDENCE

A card had been received from Barbara Fairchild thanking the Council for the use of the Recreation Field at Blossoms & Bygones.

Notification had been received that Hop Row through to the Twentypence turning in Wilburton High Street will be closed for resurfacing work on 11th/12 & 18th/19th August. Diversions along Station Road will be put in place for those two days.

Following the article in Village VOICE the Clerk was pleased to report that three parishioners had volunteered to train for the upkeep and running of the Holy Trinity Church Clock.

A problem with loose bricks on top of the wall at Feast's Green had been reported and following advice from Highways and a builder immediate steps had been taken to make it safe. Future remedial work to the wall will be considered over the coming weeks.

9. POLICE REPORT

Wednesday 2nd May – Saturday 2nd June

During the month Annie has carried out house to house enquiries in Haddenham, visited some residents in Glebe way to help resolve a boundary matter, visited a victim of crime with some reassurance and also completed other local enquires following the theft of a motor vehicle. During patrols she has issued a parking ticket on the High Street, where a van with a box trailer was parked on double yellow lines. A group of young males in Aldreth were reported to be acting suspiciously and after two vehicles were stopped and searched a small amount of cannabis type substance was recovered with one male arrested. She has also attended an address in Haddenham following a report of neighbours playing very loud music on what should have been a peaceful Sunday afternoon in the garden. There is now a confidential number to report drink and drug drivers, which launched today on Friday June 1, to coincide with the force's summer campaign. The enforcement campaign runs until the end of June but the confidential hotline will be piloted for three-months. Using the 0800 032 0845 number, which is available 24/7, people can get involved in the campaign by supplying police with information about drink and drug drivers. Theft of tools from work vans is also on the increase in the area.
