7. CORRESPONDENCE

Haddenham Galleries have been invited to be part of the Isle of Ely Arts Festival during the first week of July. A programme of exciting and extraordinary entertainment is planned including artists/artisans displaying and selling their work and running mini workshops, film shows during the afternoon and evening, live outdoor theatre plus organised music, food and drinks. The Parish Council was pleased to hear of the plans and hopes the event is very successful.

8. INFORMATION FROM DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

There was no report from Cllr Hunt this month.

Cllr P Wilson reported that in the coming week she would attend meetings to discuss a draft Food Health & Safety Policy, a proposed vision on Customer Focus Service, a revised draft Appraisal Scheme, a Leading Lights Award Scheme, the Community Safety Partnership Action Plan, a report from the recent Parish Conference and proposals for outposts to be set up with Cambridge Relate.

Cllr G Wilson reported that the plans for a six-screen cinema complex in Downham Road had been approved. There will also be ten restaurants, a car park and bus parking on the site. Mr Church, the Clerk of Haddenham Drainage Board, is retiring and discussions are being held with Middle Fen with regard to their organisation taking over the clerk's role. It is anticipated that Mr Church will continue to look after the practical side of things.

Both Cllrs Wilson had attended the public enquiry regarding the Gladman application to build 128 houses in Witchford and the East Cambs Local Plan had figured quite significantly in the argument against the proposal. The Plan is due for final approval at the next Full Council meeting and once approved it will set proper guidelines for the number of houses needed in East Cambs, which will be reviewed regularly. Cllrs Wilson had also visited the Fenland Association Community Transport premises, now that they have taken over Dial-a-Ride and they were very impressed with the set up. They have 40 buses with 2 mechanics and a good garage and it is hoped they will provide a more superior service.
