## 7. CORRESPONDENCE

Enquiries had been carried out in Aldreth Road following the theft of tools from a works van between 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> May. There had also been an attempted theft from a van in Linden Way between 3.00pm on 26<sup>th</sup> and 1.00pm on 30<sup>th</sup> May. The Clerk also advised that garden pots and plants had been stolen from the front gardens of two properties in Ashleaf Close during the night of 10<sup>th</sup> June and there was evidence that someone had also been looking in the back gardens as gates had been left open.

The Community Safety Partnership has acquired funding to help with added security for properties in East Cambs, focusing on the elderly and vulnerable in the community. The Clerk will pass details of any identified properties that might benefit from this help back to the appropriate person.

## 8. INFORMATION FROM DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Cllr G Wilson had sent a report that the Annual Full Council meeting of the District Council had been held during the month and the usual standard items of choosing the Leader and Deputy Leader and appointing members to the new Committees and Sub Committees had been carried out. It had been revealed at the meeting that of the 288 houses built in East Cambs last year only 14 of them were affordable housing.
