

3 sites in Haddenham and all showed particulate levels above safety limits set by the World Health Organisation and the EU. The daytime noise levels were high enough that planning permission would not normally be granted at those locations under the old PPG24 noise exposure standard. However, because the testing was only conducted over a short period the results cannot conclusively prove that normal levels exceed safe limits over a long period (a year), which the standards demand. The HCV recommendation is for the imposition of Traffic Regulation Orders on the A1123, B1049, B1381 and B1050 roads but this needs to be done collectively for a greater chance of success, as single applications will generally be refused with the argument that heavy traffic will be displaced to other villages. This was shown recently when an attempt by Sutton was rejected on the advice of the police. The TROs would not remove all HCV traffic as local businesses would not be affected, but it could remove up to 60% of HCV traffic that uses these roads as a short cut. It would also make the County Council's Advisory Freight Route compulsory for HCV through-traffic. During July the Group will meet with the six parish councils who will be most affected, Earith and Wilburton have already agreed in principle to pursue a collective approach.

Mr James Craven and other members of the public raised the point that there are not only concerns regarding traffic and road safety in the village but also of speed awareness. It is felt that there has been no progress with these issues over the past 18 years and that the Parish Council should push forward in a more aggressive manner to bring about changes and improvements for the parish. Mr Craven advised that he is very willing to help in any way he can and there are other parishioners who would be willing to help too. He also volunteered to become a member of the Speedwatch Team and Cllr Parr will contact him to advise when the next session is due to be arranged.

Cllr G Wilson proposed and Cllr Parr seconded that Haddenham Parish Council should agree to submit a report to the Traffic for East Cambs Group, attend a joint meeting of the parish councils and contribute to any future costs for TROs. Motion carried unanimously.
