Cllr G Wilson proposed and Cllr P Wilson seconded that all of the above accounts should be authorised for payment. Motion carried unanimously.

Cllr Hugo proposed and Cllr Tindall seconded that the invoice for Philip Emmerson should be paid out of the Aldreth Village Centre annual Precept. Motion carried by a show of 10 hands. Cllr Norman abstained.

8. CORRESPONDENCE

A letter had been received from Mr Allen of Lode Way regarding his on-going concerns about the drainage system being unable to cope with large downpours of rain. Although the Council is aware of the situation and is concerned about the repeated flooding it appreciates that Anglian Water is unlikely to invest a lot of money into resolving it because the cost of occasional clean-ups is far less than the likely cost of major capital works. There are apparently also some issues with the County Highways drainage, which another resident has raised. It is understood that the County Council is looking at the ditches in Lode Way and feedback on this issue is awaited.

Cllr Hugo raised the point that there had been no mention of letters received at the meeting the previous evening to discuss the Berry Fen wind farm application. The Clerk apologised for this oversight and advised that 39 copy letters of objection had been received but none in support. She also advised that she had acknowledged receipt of all the letters and would send them all a copy of the Parish Councils formal response to recommend outright refusal as soon as it had been finalised.

9. INFORMATION FROM DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

County Cllr Hunt advised that the outcome of the appeal for Hod Hall Lane is awaited and he had supported the application for housing as opposed to traveller pitches. He had submitted a motion for renewable energy to the District Council and this would be considered on 4th September. He had opposed both applications for 128 houses at Witchford and 100 at Wilburton Road. He also reported that the City Deal for transport/infrastructure for the whole County has now been signed with the first £100,000,000 out of a total of £500,000,000 now due.
