

- The Clerk will write to the County Council asking them to consider moving the 30mph limit further out of the village in that area. She will also point out that this is a conservation area with buildings of heritage and the damage being done to them and also bring to their attention that the road is uneven and causing unnecessary vibration. This will also be copied to Cllr Hunt.
- Cllr Cheetham will supply details of English Heritage to Mr & Mrs Innes so that they can seek their advice about the issues.

## 11. EXPENDITURE TO REPAIR ZIP WIRE

Cllr Tindall proposed and Cllr G Wilson seconded that an order should be issued to KOMPAN Ltd to repair the zip wire at a cost of £736.97 + VAT. The Clerk will ask for any surplus wire to be safely attached to the structure to be used in the future. Motion carried unanimously.

## 12. REVIEW OF CLERK'S WORKING HOURS

Cllr Tindall proposed and Cllr Parr seconded that due to an increased workload over the past three years the Clerk's working hours should be increased from 25 to 30 hours per week with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 and any exceptional additional hours worked over this level should be paid as overtime or time off in lieu. Motion carried unanimously.

## 13. PRECEPT 2015/16

Cllr P Wilson declared a pecuniary interest in this item as she had joined the meeting late. The Clerk confirmed that a dispensation was in place for Cllr Wilson.

Cllr Goddard proposed and Cllr G Wilson seconded that the Precept for 2015/16 should be set at £81,503.00, an approximate increase of 2.19% on 2014/15 and broken down as follows:

## 14. MATTERS TO REPORT

Cllr P Wilson had attended a Commercial Services Committee meeting to discuss the new leisure facility. A market testing exercise to prove greater assurance around income from the new facility had been carried out. It is expected the facility will cost in the region of £15million, which will be funded from various sources including Community Infrastructure Levy and House Bonus. Cllr Wilson was sad to report that Ely Soham Dial-a-Ride looks set to close at the end of March 2015 due to lack of funding and she is trying to put pressure on the District Council to allocate more funding to keep the service going especially in light of the Council proposing to spend £17,000 on signage for car parks.

Cllr Tindall wished to revisit the comment by Cllr Goddard regarding a new fireworks event being organised next year and pointed out that it could only be allowed to take place on Parish Council land if it was organised in the same way as the Bonfire Committee and with proper risk assessments and health and safety measures in place.

Cllr Goddard asked if the Parish Council would support a new fireworks event and this would need to be discussed at a future meeting.
