15. INFORMATION FROM DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Cllr Hunt had sent his regards to Cllr Parr and said that he has had the greatest respect for her as a Chairman and that Haddenham is lucky to have had her at the helm. She has always been a strong supporter of all things Haddenham, always helpful and a joy to work with. He is also looking forward to working with the new Chairman.

Cllr P Wilson reported that a staff survey at the District Council had returned a disappointing response. The 2013 Local Government Pay Offer of 1% increase had been accepted with effect from 1st April 2013.

Cllr G Wilson reported that there had been very few meetings due to the recent County Council elections. He would be attending a Planning Meeting to discuss the possibility of a large supermarket in Soham and plans for the boathouse in Ely. He had attended the District Council AGM where there had been a change of chairmanship. He had also attended a Haddenham Drainage Board meeting as the representative of the District Council.

- B. Allotments:** The numbering of the plots is still to be done and the weed situation is being monitored.

A work party day will be held on Sunday 2nd June at 10.00am to carry out a few jobs but mainly treating all the gates and woodwork.
