## 7. CORRESPONDENCE

The consultation on the Draft North Ely Supplementary Planning Document will run from Monday 28<sup>th</sup> October to Friday 6<sup>th</sup> December. Public exhibitions would be held at Ely Beet Club, Lynn Road, Ely on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November from 3pm to 8pm and Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> November from 9am – 2pm.

Details had been received of a possible road closure along Church Lane between 13<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> January 2014 to carry out new water connections.

A new 111 service was launched in Cambridgeshire on 12<sup>th</sup> November. The 111 number will put patients in touch with a team of fully trained call advisers, who are supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. The NHS 111 team will assess the given symptoms and offer health care advice or, where possible, book an appointment or transfer patients directly to the people they need to speak to or if necessary call an ambulance immediately. This service should be used if medical help or advice is needed urgently but it is not a life-threatening situation. For less urgent health needs patients should still contact their GP in the usual way and for life-threatening emergencies the 999 emergency services number should still be used.

Motorists are still parking illegally on the double yellow lines near the Spar Shop, despite regular patrols by PCSO Annie. Fixed penalty fines of £30 will be issued to motorists found parked illegally.

Strengthening works will be carried out to Cut Bridge, which carries the B1050, Shelfords Road, Willingham over Willingham Lode between 3<sup>rd</sup> February and 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014. Access will remain open with traffic lights during that period.

The Ouse Washes Landscape Partnership (OWLP) Stage 2 application has been submitted to the Heritage Lottery Fund and if granted the OWLP should be able to carry out its delivery plan from April 2014 until March 2017. In the intermediate period until 1<sup>st</sup> April developments will be posted through the online presence of OWLP blog and twitter pages.

## 8. INFORMATION FROM DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Cllr G Wilson had "called in" the decision of the Development & Transport Committee to contribute £1million to the upgrading and tolling of the A14, arguing that the District Council is not a highways authority and would gain nothing from the road improvement and in fact Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham and Wicken would be severely disadvantaged by the large number of additional lorries avoiding the toll on the A14. Unfortunately the motion to oppose the A14 toll and the waste of taxpayers' money was lost. The Haddenham District Councillors had been invited to a site visit of a proposed wind farm between Aldreth and Hillrow. The proposal is for four large turbines, each to generate 2 megawatts of power. Noise tests are being carried out at various locations and a contribution to the local community of £5,000 per megawatt is proposed. The Planning Committee had considered planning applications to create an out of town retail park with seven additional stores, including a DIY warehouse and an application from Tesco to build a bigger store further down Angel Drove. The plans were given approval in principle.

Cllr Allen also reported on the proposed wind farm and the planning applications for Tesco and the new retail park in Ely.

## 9. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES, WORKING PARTIES & GROUP REPRESENTATIVES

- A. Finance & Emergency Committee:** All councillors had received a copy of the draft minutes FM 04/2013 from the last meeting held on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November.
